| note 1 | This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for re-opening and closing an existing grave |
| note 2 | In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay a doctor's fee as well. This is the charge for a doctor to sign the Medical Certificate of Cremation. This fee is currently £82. |
| note 3 | For non-residents, the burial fees may be higher and additional charges may apply |
